AGING GRANT-FUNDED PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES (APS) (609) 518-4793 Services to safeguard a vulnerable adult's rights/resources to protect them from abuse, neglect, or exploitation. APS screens and investigates reports of possible abuse, neglect, and exploitation. APS identifies and arranges for services to assist vulnerable adults. Provided by Burlington County Board of Social Services. **

ASSESSMENT/OPTIONS COUNSELING (609) 265-5069 Intake Social Worker will complete an assessment that will determine the most appropriate services for the individual and identify those most at risk of nursing home placement.

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY (267) 350-8611 JEVS Human Services agency provides this program to aid individuals aged 60 years and older to help maintain independence, reduce social isolation, enable socialization, and help perform activities that might otherwise be difficult or impossible.

CAREGIVER HOUSEKEEPING SERVICE (609) 747-7745 Resources for Independent Living provides housekeeping services for seniors and their caregivers. This service provides routine basic upkeep and management of homes. It enables older persons and their caregivers to remain in their home by removing housekeeping barriers.

CONGREGATE NUTRITION (609) 702-7053 Aging office provides nutritious meals which meet the one-third dietary reference intake to residents age 60 and over at congregate nutrition sites. Recreational/social activities and informational/health-related programs are available at the congregate sites.

HOMEMAKER/HOME HEALTH AIDE SERVICES/RESPITE (609) 265-5069 Support is provided to the client for personal care activities and light household tasks related to maintaining health and allowing client to remain in their home. Provides respite for the caregiver.

HOME DELIVERED NUTRITION (609) 702-7053 Aging office delivers a nutritious meal to the resident's home which meets one-third of dietary reference intake. Clients of the program must be age 60 and over, home-bound, and unable to prepare their own meals.

INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE (609) 265-5069 Aging staff provide information and links residents to services, programs, and opportunities available in the community.

OUTREACH/PUBLIC AWARENESS (609) 265-5069 Aging staff provide presentations and public awareness events. Staff is available for informational tables at community events and senior sites. Promotes awareness of the programs, services, and information within the community.

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY/SENIOR FITNESS (856) 231-9622 Planned and structured activities aimed at improving or maintaining physical health of residents age 60 and over. Please call and ask for the Aging grant-funded program. **

HOME SECURITY INSPECTIONS (609) 265-5785 Provides free home security surveys and safety modifications to seniors and persons with disabilities. Specialists will install free door and window locks, door viewers (peepholes), reflective house numbers, and smoke/carbon monoxide detectors. Services provided by Burlington County Sheriff's Department. **

SENIOR LEGAL ASSISTANCE (800) 496-4570 Provides legal advice, assistance, and/or representation to protect and secure the rights of older persons. Program provided to residents age 60 and over and their spouses. **

SOCIAL DAYCARE/RESPIRE (856) 234-5999 Provides a safe, structured, homelike setting where older adults can socialize and participate in activities. Services are provided by The Tender, Inc. to seniors and their caregivers. **

TRANSPORTATION TO CONGREGATE MEALS (609) 702-7053 Transportation is provided, on a limited basis, to participants of the congregate nutrition program. Clients receive transportation from their home to a congregate nutrition sites. The program is provided by Aging grant funds and service is provided by Sen-Han Transit. **

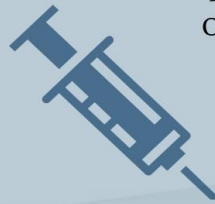

SMELL--normal structure and function of the olfactory system; disorders of smell resulting in anosmia (loss of sense of smell), hyposmia (reduced smell function), and parosmia (distortion of sense of smell).

TASTE--normal structure and function of the gustatory system; taste disorders resulting in ageusia (loss of sense of taste), hypogeusia (reduced taste function), and dysgeusia (distortion of sense of taste).

VOICE--normal structure and function of the vocal tract; processes of voice production; disorders of the voice such as laryngeal nodules, polyps, neoplasms, contact ulcers, spasmodic dysphonia, vocal tremor, and vocal fold paralysis resulting in hoarseness and weakness of the voice.

It also has an audible alarm and a speaker to enable communication between the caregiver, first responder, and the vulnerable resident. Sheriff's Department



SENIOR & VETERAN SERVICES

Free Home Security Inspections are performed by trained Sheriff's staff to make sure our seniors' homes are safe and secure. Free window locks, peep holes, reflective house numbers, smoke & carbon monoxide detectors, security locks, and power failure lights are provided when available.

Free Med-Info Packets are provided to seniors to have their complete medical history listed by their family physician. The packet of information is recommended to be placed on the home refrigerator. A program magnet is placed on the refrigerator with a sticker on the senior's front door. This will alert first responders that this information is available.

Persons-At-Risk Program allows the Burlington County Sheriff's Department to input important emergency information for any senior who may suffer from Alzheimer's, Dementia, Autism, or any other disability that may cause them to wander from their home and be unable to return home safely. The information and a photograph provided by the family is entered into the confidential law enforcement records system available to law enforcement and 911 dispatchers.

Angel Sense this is a safety device designed for those who have medical conditions, such as Alzheimer's Dementia, that cause them to wander. This device has a GPS tracking system that provides real time locations and alerts from the missing person if the individual leaves a designated area, or "safe zone." It can work with a smart phone app to control the tracking functions of the device. It also has an audible alarm and a speaker to enable communication between the caregiver, first responder, and the vulnerable resident for a safe return.

Senior Police Academy is a 6-week, 1-day per week program that provides seniors with valuable information on crime prevention, consumer fraud, public health issues, fire safety, information on court services, and all other senior services provided by the Sheriff's Department. Site visits to the county 9-1-1 center and police range are included in this informational course.

Veteran ID Cards are provided to any military veteran who has been honorably discharged from any branch of the armed forces. Appointments may be scheduled by calling the Sheriff's Department or by going to the county store at the Moorestown Mall the last Wednesday morning of each month.

Defensive Driving Course is a free 6-hour instructional course to help make drivers safer on the roadway. Participants may be eligible to receive up to a 5% discount and/or a 2-point New Jersey Motor Vehicles reduction. A \$10 fee is required for the National Safety Council certificate.

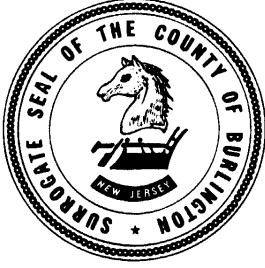

Guardianship of Incapacitated Individuals: You want to assist and protect your loved one in navigating the world around them, ensuring that they handle activities of daily living while exercising independence as safely as possible. We process the Guardianship of Incapacitated matters for the Superior Court, Chancery Division, Probate Part for both the person and the person and their property both personal and real estate.



Appoint Guardianship of Minors: There are several reasons that an appointment of a guardian of a minor is necessary. The most common is guardianship of the property when a minor is to receive assets, usually money, but also includes real estate, stocks and bonds, in amounts greater than \$5,000 per annum. We also appoint guardianship of the person of the minor.

Adoptions: The Burlington County Surrogate's Court serves as the Deputy Clerk of Superior Court, Chancery Division, Family Part for all adoptions. Our office processes the Complaints and supporting documents and schedules the hearings before the Superior Court. The Surrogate's Court also maintains the files under seal as required.

The Surrogate also acts as Deputy Clerk of the Superior Court, Chancery Division - Probate Part. In that capacity the Surrogate is responsible for estate accountings, insolvencies, actions to remove fiduciaries and similar actions brought in the probate part.
