# Message from Commissioner Allison Eckel

## Hello friends!

Summer is here and it's the perfect season to visit a Burlington County park, museum or art gallery for many of the great activities and events offered by the Burlington County Parks System.

This year is the 50th anniversary of the County's acquisition of historic Smithville and its grounds. The former Victorian industrial village was once famous for manufacturing big-wheeled bicycles and cutting-edge woodworking machines. Burlington County purchased the property and designated it as the first County park, so its preservation also marked the official start of the Burlington County Parks System.

Five decades later the parks system has grown to include more than a dozen properties totaling more than 1,000 acres, plus more than 50 miles of interior and regional trails, three art galleries and multiple museums. Each year more than a million people visit County parks properties or attend parks programs, activities and events.

Smithville remains the crown jewel of our Burlington County Parks System with a unique blend of history and natural beauty. The park is also the site of two of the County's art galleries, Historic Smithville Mansion and the Underground Railroad Museum of Burlington County. Plus several of the County's major festivals are held there each year, including the seasonal May Faire, Arts After Dark, Autumn Lands and more. It's an amazing place that offers something new and wonderful during every visit.

Another great destination to visit is the Burlington County Agricultural Center in Moorestown. The property was previously a dairy farm before being preserved by Burlington County and transitioned into a community garden and education center devoted to farming, food production, nutrition and land stewardship. It's also the site of the weekly Burlington County Farmers Market, which has received national acclaim.

Last year, the market was awarded the title of the best farmers market in New Jersey by the American Farmland Trust. Earlier this spring it was crowned No. 4 in the entire nation by USA Today's 10 BEST Readers Poll. Be sure to check it out every Saturday from 8:30 AM to 1 PM.

Residents of all ages can also look forward to a great lineup of free concerts at Smithville and the Burlington County Amphitheater beginning June 20 with the Taylor Swift tribute show, Fearless. A full schedule of upcoming shows can be found in this guide along with listings for hundreds more Parks programs, classes and events. I will look forward to seeing you at one soon!

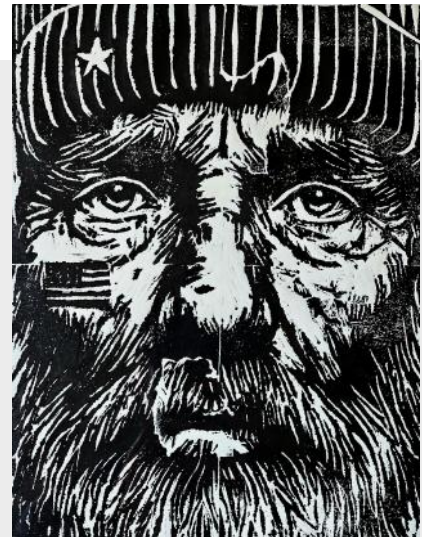

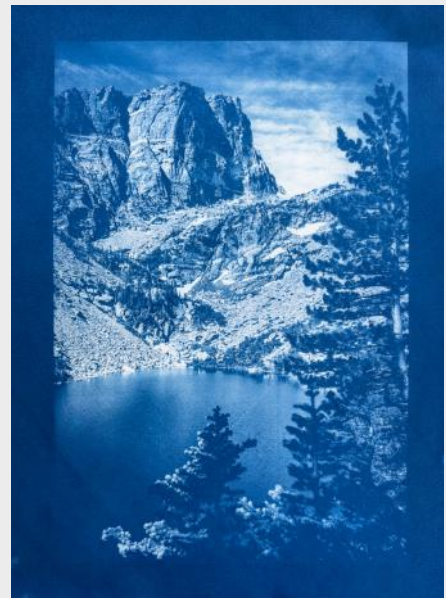

Using imagery captured within the Whitesbog Nature Preserve, near Browns Mills, NJ, Gary reimagines a landscape upon which the runaway slaves of Colonial New Amsterdam and New England once fled.

Envisioning an African diaspora longing for a place to call home, the artist asks whether the construct of an American homeland has ever been fully realized or whether the concept of freedom will forever remain a figment of our collective imagination. His practice means to purposefully upend America's bucolic pastoral traditions. This exhibition also includes a selection of Gary's Slave Notice Series, which expand upon the idea of landscape becoming a vessel of historic memory.

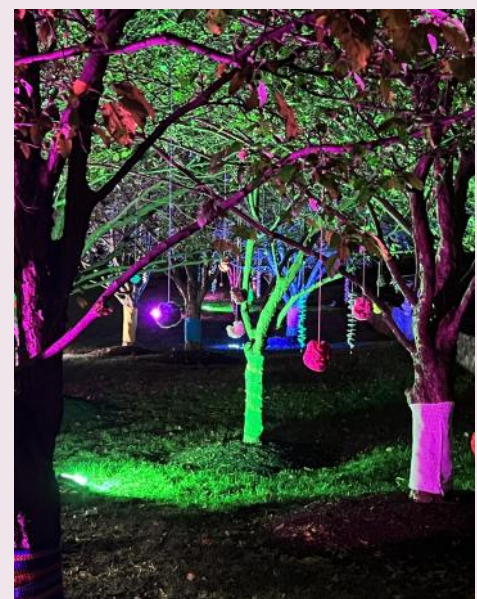

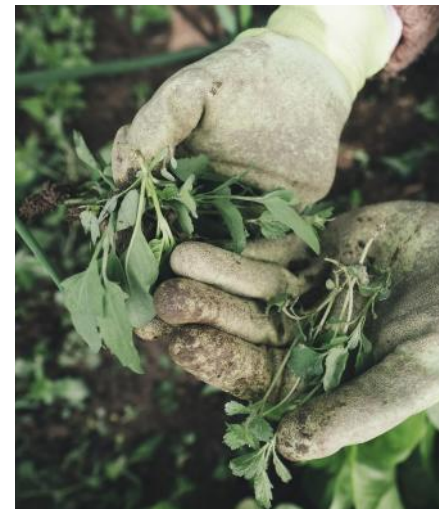

Built in 1840, the Greek Revival building is surrounded by stone and brick courtyard walls that encompass a picturesque formal parterre garden, grape arbor, and well-manicured lawns. While the Mansion is not available for rent, the courtyard grounds within the walls and a 40 x 80 event tent, with sides, may be reserved for catered affairs. From small to large events the tent can accommodate up to 160 people.

## LYCEUM OF HISTORY & NATURAL SCIENCES

The stately two and a half story Georgian building on over two acres of landscaped grounds offers a 24 x 43 foot community room and grounds that are available to rent for catered events. The maximum capacity is 72.
